



Libero Serving

The Team S libero has not served in the current set. Player #10 is supposed to serve next. The libero replaces #15, and goes to the service area. The team scores 1 point, and then scorer notifies the R2 that the wrong server served.

Now what? Do we adjust the score? Is the libero locked into this serving spot (for #10) for the remainder of the set?

Libero Serving

The Team S libero has not served in the current set. Player #10 is supposed to serve next. The libero replaces #15, and goes to the service area. The team scores 1 point, and then scorer notifies the R2 that the wrong server served.

The point is removed from Team S, and a side out is awarded. (This is noted with a square on the score sheet).

But since the libero did not replace a legal server, the libero has not served yet and may subsequently serve in any position. (In this case, for #15 as the coach planned).

Case 6.4.2 Sit A

The libero is injured during play. It is determined that the libero cannot continue, and will be replaced.

The libero is injured during play. It is determined that the libero cannot continue, and will be replaced.

How long does the coach have to re-designate a libero? 10-4-3

Redesignation does not need to occur immediately, but may occur at the discretion of the coach.

Any substitute may be designated as the libero for the injured libero.

The new libero must wear (change into) a libero jersey and remain the libero for the remainder of the set.

The libero is injured during play. It is determined that the libero cannot continue, and will be replaced.

Can the coach designate a new libero immediately, and replace the injured libero with the new libero? 10-4-3

No. The libero must be replaced by the player he/she replaced. This is the libero replacement for this dead ball. The new libero may replace the player after the next completed rally.

Team A attacks with a hard driven ball thru a block. The Team B libero, who is straddling the attack line, digs the ball with overhand action (maybe in self defense) and ball deflects above the height of the net. Then:

- A. The setter dumps the ball over the net.
- B. An attacker kills the ball.
- C. An attacker hits the ball which is blocked back into Team B's back row.
- D. An attacker hits the ball into the net, and the setter digs it up and over with a free ball to Team A.
- E. There is a joust at the net.

This can be difficult in real time – it happens so fast!

The keys to this are:

Recognizing the Libero has "set" the ball using overhead finger action.

Determining if the libero is on/in front of the attack line, or behind it.

• Easier on a dink over the block, harder on a reaction dig from a driven ball.

Determining if a legal attack has been completed.

Your R2 may be able to help you!

Team A attacks with a hard driven ball thru a block. The Team B libero, who is straddling the attack line, digs the ball with overhand action (maybe in self defense) and ball deflects above the height of the net. Then:

Legal – play continues. (There was no completed attack on the next hit.)

E. There is a joust at the net.

Illegal attack, charged to the libero. The simultaneous contact counts as a completed (and legally blocked) attack.

For simplicity sake, we'll call the order 1,2,3,4,5,6

1 served

2 served

4 served, not detected out of order

5 served, still not detected

6 served, scored 2 points, and then the table informs R2 that the wrong server is serving.

Wrong Server...

For simplicity sake we'll call the order 1,2,3,4,5,6

6 served, scored 2 points, and then the table informs R2 that the wrong server is serving.

We act on the current wrong server, and cannot change any thing for the previous servers.

- Cancel the 2 points due to a wrong server.
- Have the team back rotate to put 5 in the RB position, and 6 will be the next server.

Ideally we catch this earlier, but we didn't.



The Court and Areas

WHAT AND WHERE

The Court



Lines

Boundary lines are part of the court (entire line is in)

Center line divides the court into two equal sides

- Must be a continuous line.
- May be solid, shadow bordered, or a combination.
- Logo should not distract from line visibility.
- Put down tape if necessary on the center line


Attack line – 10' from axis of center line.

• Entire line is in the attack zone

Substitution Zone


The area near the sideline between the attack line and the center line.

THIS IS THE R2'S AREA – KEEP THE COACHES OUT



Libero Replacement Zone

The area near the sideline between the attack line and the end line.




Service Area

Behind and excluding the end line.

Laterally limited by two short lines, which are included in the serving area.


Minimum of 6 feet deep.



Playable Area


Includes the court and the unobstructed space outside of the court boundary lines.

Shall be visible to all team members and officials



Playable Area


Player must be in contact with the playable surface to play a ball over a nonplayable area.



Nonplayable Area

Space located beyond the playable area.


It includes walls, bleachers, team benches, area behind the benches, and any other areas identified in the prematch conference.



Nonplayable Area

Teams may warm up in nonplayable areas, but may not use balls to warm up.


Teams may remove/change jerseys in nonplayable areas.



Where Can Non-Players Stand?

Players may stand in the warmup area during the match.

Beyond the end of the bench or behind the bench, but NOT in front of the bench.




Coaches Area NEW

<u>Head</u> coach may stand in coaches area. Cannot designate.

1 assistant coach may stand in coaches area during dead ball.


During play, must stand no closer than 6' from sideline



Coaches Area

Coaching area is lost with a RED card to coach or bench personnel.

R2 – if coach tries to enter your zone, walk him out. If he doesn't leave with you, or if he repeatedly enters – issue a card.



Rosters and Lineups

Rosters are due at the pre-match coin toss.

Rosters are submitted to the R2.

(Any corrections to roster under 10 minutes, or for an unlisted player to enter a set : Administrative Red – Point / loss of rally when discovered)

(7-1 Pen 2,3)

Rosters and Lineups

Lineups are due 2 minutes before the first set and

1 minute before each subsequent set.

(Penalty for late lineup: Unnecessary Delay : Administrative <mark>Yellow</mark> card) (7-2 Pen 1&2)


If lineup is not submitted before the end of the timed warmup or intermission, the penalty is a second unnecessary delay, and Administrative Red card. (7-2 Pen 1&2)

Lists players in serving order


Can be on a pre-printed form, or written on a piece of notebook (or any scrap of) paper.



Signal libero to enter.


Point out captain to R1.


First player listed is in the right front position. (Will rotate into service)

Block

What is a block?

(hint – there are 3 elements)

Defined in 9-5-1c



Block


The action of a player(s)

close to the net that deflects the ball

coming from the opponent by reaching

higher than the top of the net at the moment of contact.

A block may involve wrist action provided there is no prolonged contact



Block

Block Attempt – the action of blocking without touching the ball. An attempt to block does not constitute a block.

Completed block – when the ball is touched by a blocker. Only front row players are permitted to complete a block.

Collective block – a block executed by more than one blocker in close proximity. It is completed when one of the players touches the ball. It is a blocking fault if a back-row player or libero participates in a completed collective block.

Blocking a served ball is not permitted (9-6-5)

Attacking a serve completely above the height of the net is not permitted. (9-6-6)

 However, the contact is legal, and the ball is not out of play until it completely crosses the vertical plane of the net or is legally contacted by an opponent.

Ball must cross entirely within the net antennas.

A ball may be attacked, excluding a served ball, when it has partially crossed the net.

Cannot contact a ball on the opponents side of the net, unless it is a legal block



Blocking a ball on the opponent's side of the net is permitted:

- Attacking team has completed its 3 hits
- Attacking team has had the opportunity to complete the attack, or directs the ball toward the opponent's court
- Ball is falling near the net and no attacker can make a play.



Team R overpasses the ball. The setter:

A) reaches over the net and sets the ball, which is completely on Team S's side of the net, to a teammate.

B) reaches above the net and sets the ball, which is above the net, to a teammate.

Ruling?

Team R overpasses the ball. The setter:

A) reaches over the net and sets the ball, which is completely on Team S's side of the net, to a teammate.

Over-the net violation.

B) reaches above the net and sets the ball, which is above the net, to a teammate.

Legal. Play continues.

Team R overpasses the ball. The back row setter reaches above the plane of the net to set the ball:

A) Blocker S1 blocks the ball into the setter's hand.

B) Blocker S1 blocks the set while it is still in the plane of the net.

Team R overpasses the ball. The <u>back row</u> setter reaches above the plane of the net to set the ball:

A) Blocker S1 blocks the ball into the setter's hand.

Illegal Back Row Block

B) Blocker S1 blocks the set while it is still in the plane of the net.

Illegal Back Row Attack

Joust

When two opponents cause the ball to momentarily come to rest above the net through simultaneous contact.

The player on the opposite side of the net from which the ball falls shall be considered the player to have touched the ball last.

Net Fault Signal



Signal 6

Hand of outstretched arm on the side of the net on which the fault occurred.

(You are NOT required to touch the net)

Net Faults

A player contacts any part of the net including net cables or net antennas.

- Not a fault if hair touches
- Not a fault if the ball pushes the net into the player.

A player gains an advantage by contacting the floor/wall cables, standards or first referee's platform.

Net Faults

There is dangerous contact by a player with the floor/wall cables, standards or first referee's platform.

Interference

- Contact with opponent with interferes with effort to play the ball.
- Intentional contact with playable ball under the net, and the opponent is attempting to play.

Net Faults – Case Play 9.6.7 Sit A

A player

a) contacts the referee's platform

b) grasps the standard

c) touches the net cable between the net and standard.

Net Faults – Case 9.6.7 Ruling

A player

a) contacts the referee's platform - Legal

b) grasps the standard - Legal

c) touches the net cable between the net and standard. – Net Fault

Note: in a) or b), if player gains an advantage it is illegal.

Center Line

A player may touch the floor across the center line with one or both feet/hands provided a part of the foot/feet or hand(s) remains on or above the center line. Contacting the floor across the center line with any other part of the body is illegal.

Center Line Extended

A player may cross the extension of the center line outside the court at any time provided he/she does not interfere with play by the opposing team.

Center Line Case Play 9.5.7

The LF on Team S and the RF on Team R are engaged in play at the net. Team S lands first with his/her foot partially across the center line. Team R then lands with a foot partially across the center line and on top of team S player's foot. The player on team S:

a) falls and/or stumbles and is unable to make a play on the ball falling near him/her.

b) falls and/or stumbles, but play is not affected as that player was not involved in the play on the ball.


Case Play 9.5.7 - Ruling

The LF on Team S and the RF on Team R are engaged in play at the net. Team S lands first with his/her foot partially across the center line. Team R then lands with a foot partially across the center line and on top of team S player's foot. The player on team S:

a) falls and/or stumbles and is unable to make a play on the ball falling hear him/her. – Center line violation on Team R


b) falls and/or stumbles, but play is not affected as that player was not involved in the play on the ball. – Legal, play continues

Center Line Violation Signal



Signal 2

Indicate the line where violation occurred by extending arm and pointing toward the line with the index finger.



The Serve

RULE 8

Serving

One hand, fist or arm.

Ball can be held or released.

5 seconds to contact ball after signal to serve



Serving

Serve (like any attack) must pass between the antennas

Serve can hit the net



Serving

Server shall serve from within the serving area and shall not touch the <u>end line</u> or the floor <u>outside the</u> <u>lines marking the width</u> of the serving area at the instant the ball is contacted for serve.

The server's body may be in the air over or beyond the serving area boundary lines, having left the floor from within the serving area.



Re-Serve

Called when server releases the ball then lets it drop or catches it.

Each player may have one re-serve during a term of service.

If a sub replaces a server who has used a re-serve, the new server may still have a re-serve. [8-1-5]

After the first referee's signal for service, the server :

- a) swings and misses the tossed ball
- b) swings, misses, and the ball contacts her shoulder
- c) lets the tossed ball drop to the floor

d) catches a bad toss

e) tosses the ball, then lets it drop without swinging at it, but it touches the server's knee as it drops to the floor

Ruling: ?

After the first referee's signal for service, the server :

- a) swings and misses the tossed ball re-serve
- b) swings, misses, and the ball contacts her shoulder illegal serve
- c) lets the tossed ball drop to the floor re-serve
- d) catches a bad toss re-serve

e) tosses the ball, then lets it drop without swinging at it, but it touches the server's knee as it drops to the floor – re-serve

Comment: in e) no attempt was made to play the ball.

Comment: Each player is entitled to one re-serve during any one team's term of service

Re-Serve – Case 8-1-6 Situation C

Server A recognizes that he/she is the improper server so tosses and catches the ball to force a re-serve.

Before the five seconds have elapsed, the proper server takes his/her place and makes a legal serve. They make a bad toss on the next serve and catch the ball.

Ruling: ?

Re-Serve – Case 8-1-6 Situation C

Server A recognizes that he/she is the improper server so tosses and catches the ball to force a re-serve.

Before the five seconds have elapsed, the proper server takes his/her place and makes a legal serve. They make a bad toss on the next serve and catch the ball.

Ruling: Illegal serve; loss of rally/point

Comment: The improper server has already used up the proper server's re-serve privilege for that player's term of service.

Re-Serve

A re-serve is considered to be part of a single attempt to serve.

No requests (e.g. time-out, service order, lineup, substitution, libero replacement, etc) may be recognized until after the ball is served.
